YOU can provide shelter for feral, abandoned or lost cats on your property or manage a feral colony located at a different site. Some shelter possibilities include using a garage with access to indoor/outdoors, making a space on a deck or porch, bringing them inside your basement/spare room or for those devoted cat fans, build an outdoor enclosure/house just for them.

This kit type allows you to convert an existing structure or fence into a larger outdoor play area for domestic cats. The cat fencing extension kit is an extension kit system that provides cats with more room to roam the backyard freely and get the exercise they require to stay fit. Instead of including fence posts in the extender kit, we've included our overhang extenders and the self-locking ties and fence material pet owners will need to place an impassable overhang on any existing structure over 5 feet. Homeowners only have to mount these fence extenders to existing fence line posts or to the walls of a garage, shed, or outbuilding and attach the fencing material.

“The Kitty Corral Cat Fencing of fencing is for an outside backyard setting instead of an enclosed porch. It is similar to the Purr-fect fence I have and it is wonderful. They have never been able to get into my fencing, and only one time did a cat get inside and one outside, but that was via climbing the tree that's inside my fencing, which I have to keep a slippery band around so the cats can't climb up the tree. 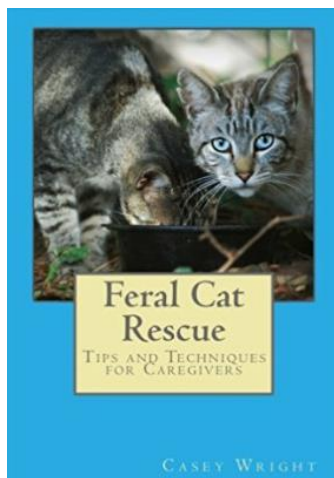


Cat Kits for Existing Fencing
